## New WashU Technology Procurement Policy

In July, the Washington University Resource Management Office and the Office of the Chief Information Officer will launch the [Washington University Technology Procurement Policy](#). The new policy will provide a defined process for both the new and recurring procurement (through purchase or lease) of computer hardware (costing at least \$150,000), software and services (costing at least \$50,000) using Washington University funds or grant funds administered by Washington University. The policy will help leverage the IT investment, ensure alignment with the IT strategy and improve the quality of vendor contracts. It is an integral part of both the university's information technology strategy and overall cost containment strategy to support the institution's academic missions of teaching, patient care and research.

## WUSTL Box Now Accepting 15GB File Uploads

The WUSTL Box maximum file size limit for uploads has increased to 15GB. Now you can upload larger files for storage and collaboration. Remember, you can access your WUSTL Box content from anywhere with a just few clicks on a desktop, laptop or mobile device. It's the secure and easy way to store and manage over 200 types of digital files.

## Shared IT Services Program Updates

### Announcing the New Washington University Information Technology

In December, the Office of the CIO (OCIO) [announced the Shared IT Services Program](#), a program to transform information technology at Washington University. The first step toward this vision is creating a trusted IT organization. Over the past few months significant work has been completed on the path to that milestone. Most recently, on June 23, the OCIO announced Information Services and Technology (IS&T), Central Information Technology Services (CITS) and the Department of Medicine IT organizations as a unified, end user-focused organization under one organizational structure aptly called Washington University Information Technology (IT).

The creation of the new Washington University IT organization represents the starting point of an innovative transformation that will continue to evolve. The unification of information technology into the new Washington University IT organization enables progression of the Shared IT Services Program. Through this program, we will create an infrastructure and service platform that facilitates the seamless sharing of information and positions the university for strategic advancement. We are moving toward the launch of multiple Shared IT Services projects. Those include:

## Unit Representatives Group

Since March, the Shared IT Services Program has been working with unit leadership to create a unit representatives group. The Shared IT Services Program Unit Representatives Group is an appointed set of individuals from campus units that meet monthly with the Shared IT Services Program leaders to collaborate on the design and implementation of the new shared IT services.

As a group, the Unit Representatives look ahead to important organizational and transition issues associated with the new shared IT services. They take on a shared responsibility in the areas of communication, collecting constituent feedback and unit readiness for each project rollout.
